Mooloolaba Rotary, the University of the Sunshine Coast and Voices on the Coast are excited to announce the 2021 annual Short Story Competition TELLING STORIES.

Open to students in Grade 4 to 9. Entry is free.

WHAT DO I WRITE?

A short story with the title: *I should have waited!*

HOW LONG SHOULD MY STORY BE?

Grade 4:	300 – 500 words
Grade 5:	400 – 600 words
Grade 6:	600 – 800 words
Grades 7 to 9:	800 – 1000 words

Dates:

Competition opens: **17 May**

Closing date for entries: **midnight 23 August**

The Top 5 in each Grade will be notified on **5 October**

Winners will be announced at the awards night at the Innovation Centre USC in the last week of October, dependent upon COVID-19 restrictions.

Prizes sponsored by FireFly Education:

1. **Overall winner - Professor Gary Crew Trophy and cash prize of \$150.**
2. **Section Winners (Grades 4 - 9) - \$50 cash and medal.** The winners will have the option of their stories published on the Voices on the Coast and Mooloolaba Rotary websites, plus inclusion in an anthology of winning entries.
3. **Runners Up - 2nd and 3rd placed entries \$25 cash and medal**
4. **Winning School - Perpetual Trophy**

PLEASE NOTE: to qualify for the Winning School Perpetual Trophy, the school must have at least 20 registered students.

Judging:

Teachers will submit the top three entries for each grade from each school. The longlist of entries will then be judged under the auspices of the Creative Writing Program, USC.

Entries will be judged on:

- Conformity to checklist
- Originality - entries should not have been previously published
- Expression (i.e. it must be well-written)
- Imaginative content

Conditions of Entry:

1. Open to schools and students on the Sunshine Coast and Hinterland, including Home School students.
2. One entry per student and must be the original work of the entrant.
3. The judges' decision is final, and no individual correspondence will be entered into.
4. Entries must be typed, Times New Roman 12' font, double-spaced.
5. Please include a word-count next to the title of your story as well as on the entry form.
6. Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form.
7. All entries to follow naming conventions on the Jotform website.
8. Entry form (PDF format) and entry (Word doc) must be uploaded electronically to the JotForm website at tinyurl.com/TellS2021
9. PLEASE NOTE: the teachers name must be recorded. (Important because of the teacher's undertaking).

Important note on plagiarism:

Should an entrant be awarded a prize for a story found to be plagiarised, the entrant shall refund all prize money to the organisers on demand.

Checklist:

- Have you filled out and completed the entry form correctly?
- Have you written your name on the form?
- Have you proof-read your story?
- Have you written your FIRST name at the end of your story?
- Have you included a word count next to the title of your story?

Once you have ticked all the above boxes submit your entry electronically to your teacher. Teachers will then submit the top three entries from each grade.

Home School students can submit their entries electronically as per the above instructions.

PLEASE NOTE: Entries submitted without a teacher's signature will be EXCLUDED from the competition.
